#### **Class News**

#### Reception:

We have had an exciting week learning about Chinese New Year. We cooked noodles in our home corner and had a really good try at using chop sticks. We learnt about the Chinese Zodiac and the animal that relates to the year we were born. The dragon dance was probably the highlight of the week as we noisily stomped through the school! Last week we were identifying different coins and then played shop to buy items. This was quite a challenge, especially when we tried to find different ways of making specific amounts. We reinforced our skills on analysing data in the forest- creating block graphs to determine the various leaves that are found in the forest. This week we have been identifying some of the animals that live in the ocean and deciding on which ones we want to find out more about. Our William Turner display has certainly made an interesting talking point and has brightened up our classroom. The children will bring them home, but not for a while!!Thank you for your support.

#### Year One:

This fortnight, Year 1 have been learning about Chinese New Year, and the race which decided the names of each year. The children discovered whether they were born in the year of the goat or the monkey, and that 2022 is the year of the tiger. They have created lanterns, zodiac animal masks, cooked noodles, and performed a brilliant dragon dance. In maths we have been finding different combinations of coins to make a total, as well as giving and receiving change. Continuing our topic of Commotion in the Ocean, we have begun choosing our materials to make our boats. We also had a very exciting letter in a bottle arrive in the class-room last Friday that had arrived all the way from the ocean! Year 1 created wanted posters to help capture Captain Kidd who had stolen Pirate Pete's treasure, and then we stained them with tea to make them look older. I wonder if Pirate Pete will find his treasure soon...

#### Year Two:

What a busy couple of weeks in Y2! We have enjoyed celebrating Chinese New Year by trying a delicious vegetable stir fry, making lanterns and finding out about how it is celebrated. We also enjoyed watching Chinese dragon dances and writing our name in Chinese with mud paint at Forest School. We have been learning about the seven life processes through MRS GREN and how these apply to both humans and animals. Last week we carried out our Bird Watch, collecting data and representing it as a graph and pictogram. We were surprised by the types of birds we saw and comparing this data to Y3s from forest school. We have also been developing our ball skills in football for accuracy and control and have even had some mini matches! Y2 have been using MusicLab to develop their skills in creating music digitally—great thought has been given to how the music makes us feel. We were also very proud to be part of the 100th Birthday Celebrations of Mr Urdd, taking part in a record breaking birthday song!

What a lovely couple of weeks we have had in Year Three! Forest schools has included whittling sticks, bird spotting and estimating and measuring the heights of trees. We have been learning about the types of British birds, collecting data on them and creating both tally charts and bar graphs related to them. We have also enjoyed making washing peg bird feeders for our feathered friends. We have retold the story of St Dwynwen in Literacy and been using gymnastic skills with equipment as well as developing passing skills in football. Year threes have been celebrating Chinese New Year through reasoning in numeracy, eating a healthy stir fry and writing our names using Chinese symbols.

#### Year Four:

It has been yet another busy few weeks in Year 4 and we have been so pleased with the hard work and focus shown from all the children. Through our Science and Technology AOLE focus we have been investigating the layers of the ocean, what lives in each layer and how and why we need to filter water. Our experiment to show the effectiveness of different filters gave us some incredible results! Maths has taken us outside to investigate angles and multiply by 10, 100 and 1000. This week in our Expressive Arts sessions we have started to look at various Welsh artists such as Clive Gould and Vernon Jones, who create seascape pictures. The children looked at their pieces and thought about what emotions they generate. We will be looking at creating our own images next week! We have continued with our gymnastic work in P.E, moving on from individual sequences to paired sequences using both the floor and apparatus. The children have really worked hard to improve body tension and control when balancing and travelling. During music sessions, we have been learning to perform a rap called 'Stop' all about bulling and are now beginning to compose our own verse in the same style- it has been lots of fun! We are continuing with learning some basic French phrases and now trying to use this during daily routines. Thank you for all the fantastic homework we have seen, it really is lovely to see the children extending their learning at home too.

#### Year Five:

Over the last couple of weeks in Year 5 we have continued our work on Kensuke's Kingdom, finding out more about Kensuke's Island, writing character descriptions and roleplaying different characters to find out how we can 'show not tell' emotions. Linked to our Literacy, we have imagined that we were stranded on an island with no water to drink. We worked in groups to plan and carry out an investigation to see if we could filter dirty water to make it safe enough to drink. This was tricky to start with, but we were able to alter our investigations, trying different combinations of materials, with the end result being some extremely effective filters!

We have started to look at seascapes by a range of Welsh artists, in particular how different emotions are conveyed through the paintings, in preparation for creating our own next week. We have really enjoyed learning some French phrases and practising in conversations with different people, and look forward to continuing this throughout the term.

#### Year Six:

Well it's been another busy couple of weeks in Yr6. We are really getting into our new topic Blue Abyss and are learning about the oceans and seas around the world, the names of the different layers of the oceans and the animals who inhabit them. We have enjoyed reading the story of Kensuke's Kingdom, learning about the different characters and the adventures they have. We have written interesting diary entries and debated the idea of leaving everything and sailing around the world. Surprisingly, most of the children decided they wouldn't want to leave their friends and family and they didn't like the idea of not having any wifi! In maths we have been learning about angles in shapes and now know that angles in a triangle add up to 180 degrees and in a quadrilateral it's 360 degrees. We have also really enjoyed another 2 weeks at swimming which has been fantastic.
