PTFA Christmas Clothing Swap Shop



Class News

Reception:

Reception have had a busy two weeks; we are enjoying spending time with Year 1 and 2 to practise our Christmas Nativity performance and the children are really excited to share this with you in the coming weeks. If I could ask you continue to practise the songs at home, this would be extremely helpful. Just a reminder that all costumes need to be brought into school, in a bag, with your child's name, on by the 5th of December at the latest. I'm sure the children have already told you about the magic paintbrush, we've had a huge mystery in Reception as we don't know where it has come from or who brought it. Along the way the children have had some lovely discussions around our new topic Magic and Mystery, and we are still waiting to find out who put it in our classroom, I wonder when we will find out? The children have also decided upon their enterprise design and this week we are beginning to make our products in preparation to sell to you, the children are extremely excited. This week in numeracy we have been focusing on measuring different lengths. The children have measured themselves to find out if they are taller or shorter than objects in our classroom. In Welsh, the children have been learning the different colours in a rainbow and have begun learning 'Iliwiau'r enyfs'. As a reminder, reading books need to be brought in to school every day for us to read with your child, on a Thursday the books will be changed and handed out on a Friday. The books will only be changed once they have read three times with a comment, thank you for your continued support.

Year One:

This fortnight, Year 1 have had a couple of very wet Forest Schools! The children have shown great resilience to the wet and cold, putting their all into making magic wands, potions and tree spirits. Please try to pop some spare socks in your child's bag on a Monday, as we have a limited supply in school. We have begun creating our Enterprise products and are excited to sell these to you. The children have really put their hearts into their work with these! Our Foundation Phase Nativity rehearsals are well under way. I have sent out songs and lyrics to be practised on j2homework. Costumes must be in school **no later than Monday 5th Dec**. This fortnight has also been full of language learning, with children finding 'The Enyfs in Me' – recapping the colours in Welsh – and identifying emotions in German. Da iawn and toll arbeits!

Year Two:

It has been a very busy couple of weeks in Year Two. Despite the cold and rainy weather, we have been learning lots through fun activities. In literacy we have created posters to advertise Children in Need Day, highlighting the importance of the charity. Pupils dressed up in spotty clothing and costumes to celebrate the day. In numeracy we have been learning that multiplication is in fact repeated addition and we have been revising both the x2 and x10 tables. We also used our Forest Schools visit to learn about symmetry and create symmetrical art. Pupils also enjoyed a visit from 'Safety Seymour' in our carbon monoxide awareness workshop. They were great ambassadors for our school; listening well and asking thoughtful questions. We have been learning how to ask about possessions in Welsh and greet someone in French. The pupils have been practising really hard for the upcoming nativity and are looking forward to performing for you .




Year Three:

Over the last few weeks in Literacy, we have been studying the picture book *Varmints*, about a creature whose habitat is destroyed, as well as watching the short film adaptation. We have been using a range of different techniques to develop our descriptive writing, including contrasting conjunctions, extended noun phrases and personification. Linked to our work in Literacy, our Science learning has been looking at different habitats around the world. We have started to find out about the essential elements a habitat needs to have, the needs of different animals, and which animals are suited to living where through a range of activities – researching to find out information, creating different habitats from construction materials, building a 3d triarama representation of our chosen habitat, and sorting animals using Venn diagrams according to their needs. Our Numeracy work has focussed on telling the time on an analogue clock – knowing what each hand represents, how to read the hands, and the key numbers on the clock face. Our work making a natural clock in Forest School really helped to consolidate our understanding. We then moved on to digital time, and converting between the two. This week we have started to prepare for our Year 3 and 4 nativity, which we hope you will all be able to attend. Children should have brought home their lines to learn, and we have discussed what they need to wear - I have posted information regarding costumes on our Google Classroom. I have also uploaded the songs – tracks and lyrics – that we are learning into our Year 3 Google Shared Drive so that the children can continue to practise at home.


Year Four:

A busy few weeks again in Year 4! We have been studying the novel- *Varmints*. This is a beautiful, thought-provoking picture book with dramatically lit artwork and intriguing text. *Varmints* tells of a pastoral world in need of protection, and of the souls who love it enough to ensure its regeneration. The children have been using a range of connectives to extend their written work and identifying noun phrases. In Numeracy we have been identifying digital time on a 24-hour clock. We then used this knowledge to solve a code breaker and devise an itinerary for the World Cup. The children have also looked at reading information from a timetable, including working out journey durations. (We will be keeping an eye on the scores whichever team we support!). Come on Wales, I mean England, I mean.....! This week we are starting our Enterprise project. We will design and plan what we want to make, price how much items cost and how much profit we want to make. Hopefully you will like our items and buy them, (PLEASE). We are now busily preparing for our school Nativity. Hopefully your child has some lines to learn and knows what they need to wear. Any problems please pop in or drop us an email. At Forest School the children were creating clock times out of natural materials. We were so impressed with their creativeness- numbers made from moss, sticks and leaves. We even had a clock with roman numerals made out of twigs. Thank you for your support.



Year Five:


It has been a busy fortnight in Year 5. We have begun to look at our new topic – ‘Power, Politics and Protests.’ This has allowed us to have really detailed and informative discussions in terms of issues that have arose in the world both in the past and present. For this topic, we have been looking at the film ‘Hidden Figures’ which focusses on the lives of Mary Jackson, Dorothy Vaughan, and Katherine Johnson. The children have really enjoyed learning about how these three women have influenced our history in terms of the world of space, science, and the fight for equality. As well as this, the children have also been looking at ‘The Windrush.’ They have created mind maps to display key information as well as worked collaboratively with Year 6 to create a Windrush timeline. The children braved the cold and were able to use different resources and natural materials to complete this. Last week, we showed our support for road safety week, anti-bullying week and children in need. We learnt about different road signs, designed our own odd socks, and surrounded them with ‘kind words’ as well as wore lots of colourful spots and dots. In particular, the children had so much fun in creating their own ‘children in need activities.’ These ranged from code breakers, colour by numbers and board games. Miss Light certainly enjoyed playing some of the board games alongside them. Not only that, but Miss Light would also like to say a very special thank you for a lovely first few weeks in Year 5! Have a lovely weekend and we look forward to seeing what the next two weeks brings.



Year Six:

It has been a fortnight of visits and visitors for Year 6. We were very lucky to receive a visit from the CO Crew who came to teach us about the dangers of carbon monoxide and how we can keep ourselves safe. The Blake Theatre was the venue for a science workshop where we were able to watch some very impressive experiments using air and fire. We then welcomed Gwent Police to school as part of our Heddlu Bach initiative and learned all about the training and work of police dogs. Our final trip was to the football fan zone at Rodney Parade to watch Wales v Iran, such an incredible experience for our children, kindly given to them by the PTFA. In the classroom we have begun our new topic of Power, Politics and Protest. This has led us to learning more about the Windrush, the reasons they left the Caribbean and the treatment they received upon arriving in the UK. For literacy we have focussed on the film “Hidden Figures” which follows three black women who helped NASA to launch it’s first rocket and the discrimination they suffered along the way. The children have studied this with such sensitivity and maturity, da iawn blwyddyn 6. Children in Need was a spotty/socky day with the children looking wonderful as they raised money for CIN and celebrated anti-bullying week. We have also begun designing and costing products for our Christmas Enterprise Week, watch this space for the fantastic products they will soon be making!

Worrying about money?

You are not alone. Money worries are more common than most of us realise. It might be an unexpected drop in income, bills starting to pile up, or finding it harder to cover the basics - these issues can affect anyone.

Remember, there's more help available than you might think. There are people and organisations who can help with some of the most common financial problems. These might include:

- Checking to see if you're entitled to more money in benefits or small grants.
- Help with reducing essential costs and connecting with local support.
- Advice on managing debts and ways to reduce your repayments.
- Help getting back into work or into more secure employment.
- Support to help you stay in your home.

If you are struggling it is always better to seek help and advice sooner rather than later - but it is also never too late to ask for help. You may be surprised at how much can be done to help you get back on your feet.

We have a short guide to help you see the types of help and support that are available, with details of national organisations as well as local links and connections. Help may be available in places you might not expect.
