Class News

Reception:

It is lovely to see you all back after the Easter holidays. It's been lovely to hear about your time spend with your families and friends. Reception have been super excited this week to welcome the chicks back into our classroom, they have grown so much over the past two weeks. We can't wait to jump into our new topic called 'inventors of tomorrow', we've even started to talk about what we can invent for the chicks when they go outside in a few weeks. We have been learning in Numeracy how to count in tens. In science, we have explored experiments in preparation for our new topic, we got to make predictions and test each one to find out if the objects could float or sink. In PE this half term, we have started bat and ball skills and athletics, and the children are very excited to take part in developing their new skills. We can't wait to explore our topic this term and carry on our learning journey. Thank you for your continued support each week.

Year One:

Welcome back Year 1! I hope you all had a brilliant Easter break. So far this summer term we have talked about our new topic, Inventors of Tomorrow, thinking about what the children would like to learn about. Think rockets, robots, planets, experiments... In maths we have been looking at tally marks, block charts and pictograms, collecting and recording data in different ways, and in writing we have been using verbs to write instructions on how to babysit a grandma! In Forest School we created obstacle courses and gave instructions for others to complete them. Da iawn pawb.

Year Two:

Welcome back for our third and final term in Year two. This week we have been learning to tell the time. Pupils are learning that when the big hand is pointing at 12 it is o'clock; at 6 it's half past; 3 its quarter past and 9 it's quarter to. We have been practising our x5 tables to help read a clock. In literacy, we have started to list the features of non-chronological texts and highlight these in examples. Pupils have been enjoying the outdoors in PE lessons, including throwing, catching and passing a rugby ball. In ICT, pupils have been collecting data to create a tally chart.

Year Three:

It has been lovely to welcome all the children back for our final term in Year Three! This week in Maths we have been working hard on fractions — we began by identifying halves, quarters and thirds of shapes, before moving on to finding a fraction of an amount of objects. In Literacy we have started to look at non-chronological reports. We have looked at different examples to identify what features a report will have, and have started to plan out our own report about an animal of our own choice. This term we will be learning to play the glockenspiel - we have practised playing different rhythms, and are getting to know what different musical symbols mean. Bendigedig all — a great start!

¥ear Four:

We hope that you all had a lovely Easter and managed to get some rest, ready for the busy term ahead! Let's hope the weather will start to get a little warmer. Our topic this term is "Champions." We have encouraged the children to think about the meaning of champions and what it means to them. It can be a sporting, musical, artistic, a hero etc. In Literacy we have been recapping the skills we have learnt last term and then creating a recount about our Easter holidays. We wanted the children to use their imagination to create this piece of writing. So, for example, searching for treasure with pirates, riding the waves with a whale etc. We will be commencing Forest School next Tuesday 25th April and then every other week. In Science, we have been investigating air resistance and how it affects how things move. The children had lots of fun as well as keeping fit by running three times across a distance and comparing this to running with a parachute attached to our waist. In Numeracy we have been getting to grips with decimal numbers, focusing on tenths and hundredths. We have looked at multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100. We are excited to be taking part in a Primary Cluster Modern Foreign Languages project all about developing language skills through a fairy-tale- over the next few months we are going to be looking at 'Petit Chaperon Rouge,' yes you guessed it... Little Red Riding Hood. (More details to follow on this.) Thank you for your continued support.

Year 5

What a great start to our Summer term this week has been and it's lovely to welcome all the children back after the Easter holiday. We started our literacy, I'm a clever writing with a recount where we retold events which 'happened' over the holidays; we found out that some children went to the moon, met a gigantic Easter bunny, and ate huge Easter eggs. (Well, that's what they told me they did, although I was a little suspicious when one of them told me they went swimming in a giant chocolate river!) In maths we have started to look at budgeting and learning the difference between what we need and what we want. We looked at a household budget and many decided they could live without a mobile phone when they found out how much they cost. In science we completed an investigation on breathing and learning about lung capacity. We also enjoyed our PE with Mrs Fawsitt playing a game of rounders and Mrs Body with outside yoga and meditation. We really enjoyed developing our French language skills and are looking forward to receiving a reply from our French pen pals, which we hope will be very soon. We are all looking forward to a busy Summer term and would like to thank you for your continued support.

Year Six:

It has been lovely to welcome everyone back into class after the Easter holidays. Unbelievably we are now entering our last term at Trellech! Our first week back has been super busy as we introduce our new top-ic, Champions. For science we have completed an investigation into air resistance, timing how fast we can run with and without a parachute. Lots of fun was had whilst testing our predictions. For maths we have been looking into money and finances, how the jobs we do link to the pay we receive and the difference between wants and needs. So many interesting conversations in class when we diamond ranked 9 jobs with different annual salaries, weighing up the amount we would be paid compared to the risks, rewards, responsibilities and enjoyment. For literacy we have recounted our Easter holiday, with a twist. We wanted the children to use their creativity combined with the skills they have learnt during the last term to let their imagination run wild. In forest school the children were challenged to create a habitat for a wild animal and really thought carefully about the needs of the animal. Excitement is mounting in preparation for our residential to Gilwern, please keep any eye on twitter where I will post updates of our adventures!
