Class News

Reception:

This past two weeks Reception have really emerged themselves into our new topic 'Inventors of tomorrow'. We have been looking at the history of the code that was created by Margaret Hamilton that helped land Apollo 11 on the moon. The children have created their own leaflet about Margaret with facts about her life. In Numeracy we have been looking at finding fact families of certain numbers, along with exploring capacity to make sure we have enough drinks for our coronation party. Reception have also been exploring their DCF skills and creating their own code to land a rocket on the moon. I was very impressed with their determination and ability to use the correct software. In forest school, we created our own version of stain glass frames. We worked together to explore the positioning of the natural objects using the terminology we had covered in our prior learning. We have had a very busy week getting ready for the Kings Coronation. We have designed our own stamps crowns and plates, celebrated with Busybodies Day Nursery and finished off our week with a lovely family picnic. We are super excited to start exploring and designing our scribble bots in the coming weeks and put our inventions to the test. Thank you for your continued support.

Year One:

This fortnight, Year 1 have been studying Margaret Hamilton. The children loved discovering how she helped land Apollo 11 on the moon. They wrote a non-chronological report on her life and work, as well as using Scratch Jr. to write their first computer code. In maths we have been focussing on tens and ones, using that understanding to find the pattern of odd and even numbers. In our Forest School at school session last week we created beautiful 'stained-glass' natural pictures using frames, sticky tape and nature. I hope you have been able to have a look at them when picking up and dropping off! In PE we have started our athletics and tennis sessions. Children have focussed on running and jumping skills in preparation for our Sports Day, as well as beginning to learn how to hold and use a tennis racket.

Year Two:

Year two have written a non-chronological report on a woodland animal, using subtitles to organise their research and have drawn a labelled diagram of their chosen creature. The pupils have spent time evaluating their own work against an agreed success criteria to be able to improve their work in the future. In numeracy, pupils have been solving time related problems and working hard to achieve their times tables badges. They are proudly wearing these different colours around school to display the level they are on. It's been great to see confidence building with this. Year twos have started to learn woodworking skills which enhances thinking, creativity, hand – eye coordination and fine motor skills. A huge thank you to our wonderful PTFA who have raised money to help us buy the necessary tools and equipment to carry out these valuable lessons. We have recently been learning how to hammer in and remove nails safely. We will be learning how to use saws, hand drills and screwdrivers safely in the coming weeks. The pupils have been also been creative when designing coronation crowns and coins in expressive arts.

Year Three:

In Literacy year three have been learning to write a non-chronological report. We have been looking at examples to identify features, and carrying out independent research before writing our own report about our favourite animal. We used our digital skills to present our work, thinking about layout, how to organise information, and using images to make it eye-catching. In Maths we have been working on measuring accurately with a ruler using cm and mm, and exploring the different ways we can write measurements. The children have found out lots about the coronation ready for Saturday's celebrations – we learnt some interesting facts about the history and key parts of the ceremony. We have designed and made our own version of St Edward's crown which we are all very excited to wear for our picnic, and have been very creative in designing a celebration coin and set of commemorative stamps to mark the occasion.

Year Four:

We have been busy with lots of Coronation activities- making and decorating a crown, designing a postage stamp and learning few songs to sing all about the King. Last week we created poems in the style of A.A. Milne- If I were a King. These were absolutely amazing. This week we have been looking at the Coronation invitations and what each symbol represents. Did you know that central to the design is the motif of the Green Man, an ancient figure from British folklore, symbolic of spring and rebirth, to celebrate the new reign? The shape of the Green Man, crowned in natural foliage, is formed of leaves of oak, ivy and hawthorn, and the emblematic flowers of the United Kingdom. We will be displaying some of the children's work in S. Nicholas Church. Last week we were lucky to have a visit from author Lee Newbury. We gained a wonderful insight into his journey to becoming an author and the inspiration for his books. We hope those who purchased one are enjoying them! We are trying to develop our little garden area outside our class, so if you have any plants we can use, we would be grateful. Also, we are looking for some cable reels of different sizes if you know anyone that has any spare. Thank you for your continued support.

Year 5

Year 5 have spent the last two weeks learning about the history of the Coronation and preparing for the celebration of the King's Coronation on Saturday. They have used their mapping and measuring skills to plan out the route of the King's Coronation and compared with the route with the Queen's Coronation in 1953. They made their own grid and then used the co-ordinates to identify the famous landmarks which line the route taken during each event. They have been studying the new royal emblem and redesigning their own using the symbols of the flowers of each of the nations. Following the Draw with Rob online activity they have drawn their own Coronation crown, I was extremely impressed and we really do have some very talented artists in Y5. During our visit to forest school this week we designed a throne fit for a king, well a teddy king which was great fun and we had some very inventive designs. During our time in the forest we also collected twigs which we have then used to turn into our own crowns to wear when we celebrate the Coronation in school. During literacy we were inspired by the A.A. Milne poem If I were a king and thought of lots of fun and mischievous things we would do if we could be king and decided it would be amazing if we had invitations to the King's Coronation party so we made ourselves Princes and Princess and created our own invitations to the event, I wonder if we can use them on Saturday! We also had another visit from Mrs Cornish who continues to help use develop our garden areas to enjoy throughout the summer. Thank you again for your continued support, from Year 5.

Year Six:

What an incredible two weeks year 6 have had! I cannot begin to tell you how proud I am of each and everyone of them during our residential at Gilwern. The teamwork, kindness and friendship shown to each other was incredible. Our time there began with settling in to our new accommodation followed a walk up the Blorenge, seeing fossilised palm trees and rolling down "Teletubby land" as it was named by the instructors. Our second day consisted of canoeing, climbing, high ropes and a very high game of human jenga using crates and ropes! Following a talent show which showcased comedy, singing and sketches, everyone definitely slept well. Our last day meant packing and emptying dorms, then team building games where the children had to cross an acid river, transport toxic waste, navigate a wobble board, complete a gutter run and spiders web challenge. The bus home was definitely a lot quieter than the way there! A huge thankyou to Mrs Voaden, Mrs Harding, Miss Gregory and Mr Smowton for their help whilst away. On our return we turned our attention to all things coronation. In forest school the children have made thrones fit for a King using nothing but natural materials — they truly were regal! We have also written invitations to the coronation focussing on the symbolism, researched the history of coronations, designed our own emblems to represent the four nations, made eco friendly crowns and drawn a new stamp. Our week was brought to a close with a lovely family picnic. Thank you for your continued support as we head into the summer term.
