#### National Test Data

All learners from year 2 to 6 have recently taken personalised assessment tests in numeracy, reasoning and reading through the Welsh Government platform Hwb. These assessments are on-line and are adaptive, meaning that questions are selected based on the responses to previous questions. This provides a tailored assessment experience for each learner and will help all learners develop their skills through understanding what they can do, the things they may need to work on, and their next steps. The assessments provide schools with information on the skills of individual learners, groups and whole classes. They are also another way for us to help your child, improving and building confidence in their own ability. You are now able to access the results from this year's personalised assessments through their Hwb login.

# **Class News**

# Reception:

In maths this fortnight Reception have explored the properties of shapes by making robots out of 2D shapes, as well as introducing the concept of measuring time by timing how many star jumps we could do in a minute. We have begun to design and create our Scribblebots ready to equip with motors next week. In Forest School we have made our Scribblebots using natural resources, as well as joining Year 1 for a session of outdoor yoga. In PE we are beginning preparations for Sports Day and have been practising our bat and ball skills. A big thank you to Mr and Mrs Holmes for supplying us with the materials and helping to create our new outdoor planters with the help of Mr and Mrs Kyte. Reception have thoroughly enjoyed filling them with soil and planting seeds! Thank you to all for your continued support.

# Year One:

In Year 1 we have written letters to Mrs Peacock thanking her for our coronation picnic, and have begun to plan our very own fictional stories which we will be turning into books. For maths we have been learning about tens and ones, as well as spotting halves, thirds and quarters of shapes. After missing two weeks of Forest School due to Bank Holidays our visit this Monday was fantastic. We invented our own games and played them with each other and started a brand new book to read over the Summer Term. Making the most of the weather we have also been planting flowers in our garden, enjoying athletics and tennis and tackling challenges during the daily mile. In Expressive Arts the children have been recreating one half of their face using nuts and bolts (and other bits and bobs) to become half robot. The results have been very impressive so far!

# Year Two:

In year Two we have written a letter to King Charles congratulating him on his coronation and we have written reports on the Tour de France (Which is this term's topic). In numeracy we have been revising measuring skills using both centimetres and metres; we have found fractions of amounts and recognised patterns in numbers such as  $6 \times 2 = 12 \text{ so } 60 \times 2 = 120$ , etc. Pupils have been learning to tie both clove hitch knots and square lashings to create a frame made of twigs at Forest schools. This proved to be both challenging and fun. In Science and technology we have been creating pictograms on Just 2 Easy and have designed and made a helmet for an egg to protect it from smashing. The children really enjoyed testing them out by dropping from a height. We linked this to the potential dangers of cyclists wearing the correct protection on their heads. In Welsh we have been learning to ask where someone is going and answer where and on what day.

# <u>Year Three</u>

Over the last couple of weeks, we have been using the skills we learnt to create another non-chronological report, this time all about the Tour de France in line with our new topic. We have already found out lots of information and some interesting facts to include. Our Maths has continued to focus on measurement, moving on to looking at m and cm. We have been finding equivalent measurements to compare and order, and practised drawing lines accurately. In Expressive Arts we started to work on the tricky task of learning French through music – we began by signing Frere Jacques and finding out what the song was about, and now we are learning how to play the tune on the glockenspiel. I have been so impressed with how well the children are picking this up – they are doing a great job of remembering and playing the correct notes, keeping to the beat, and playing altogether. C'est fantastique!

**Year 4** A busy few weeks again in Year 4 which has seen us focus on our French project that we are taking part in with other schools in our cluster. It's all about learning French through a fairytale - Petite Chaperon Rouge (Little Red Riding Hood0 We have looked at body part names such as bouche, nez and yeux. See what they can tell you about a 'cognate' too- I'm sure you will be impressed! In maths we have been looking at factors and multiples- the children are becoming quicker at realising that any even number must have a factor of 2 and multiples of 10 must have factors of 10 etc. I wonder if the higher the number, the more factors it has? Something to ponder over!! We have started some practising for sports day today, which has been exciting! Lots of healthy competition already!!

# Year Five

Another two weeks have passed in Y5 and what a busy couple of weeks it has been. Our focus has been letter writing in Literacy with last week seeing us writing letters to King Charles III and Queen Camilla to find out about the Coronation. In maths we have been identifying the best deals in the supermarkets and have discovered that not all deals are what they seem and might actually cost you more. We have started our Champions topic by discussing in our progression steps what qualities they believe are important in being a champion. We were very impressed with the range of qualities suggested, including ones that the teachers hadn't even thought about. Following on from this we have been looking at what makes a good sport and how we can demonstrate those qualities in our own actions. On Monday we left Trellech for our residential visit to Viney Hill Adventure Centre, with bags packed, I think some thought we might be staying all week, we boarded the bus very excitedly. Wow! What a great three days we had, including the weather and I can't express enough how proud I am of all the class and the way they represented themselves and Trellech Primary School so positively. From tunnelling to the high climbing wall, from navigation to bush craft everyone gave it 100%, challenging themselves to complete activities even when they were a little unsure. I would like to say thank you, on behalf of Mrs Body, Miss Light and myself to all the children and their amazing attitudes whilst we were away—you are all superstars and it was a privilege to be part of such amazing memories.

# YearSix:

Two weeks seems to have flown by since our return from Gilwern. For literacy we have focussed on recounting our time away using bullet journals, a unique form of creative writing that includes writing and drawing. The children recalled their time away under specific headings, adding key visual images and persuading others why they should have their residential there. The results were wonderful and we will be sending them off to Gilwern as our thankyou to them. This week's literacy carries on with the theme of persuasion with year 6 analysing job adverts and writing new ones for the roles of ambassadors, house captains etc. They will be ready for year 5 to look at when move up day comes around. Our maths has had a money focus, deciding on the best deals in supermarkets and understanding why and how banks look after our money. We had some fantastic discussions about virtual money and the difference between credit and debit cards. We have also taken our first steps into algebra by investigating mathematical rules and how to test them. Our topic of Champions has begun in earnest, with progression step three working together to find the qualities of a champion and then diamond ranking them according to the importance each child gave them. The collaboration was amazing with qualities such as resilience, determination, belief and honesty. We have also discussed how to be a good sportsperson and on the flip side, a good loser, the children all agreeing that the requirements didn't just apply to sports but lots of areas in life. In forest school we have made assault courses out of natural materials and begun our research on the Tour de France. Finally, to end our week we have been putting our learning of food in French to good use by starting to read La chenille affamée (the Very Hungry Caterpillar). We will keep you updated on our progress!
