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Class News

Reception:

Reception have had another lovely week. We have fully engrossed ourselves in our topic 'healthy, confident me'. We have harvested our vegetables we have been growing over the past few months and created our own potato salad. It was lovely. In Numeracy we have been looking at taking away an amount from another, the children have completed activities independently and together to support their learning. In Literacy, we have been looking at identifying capital letters and character descriptions. We are putting the final touches on our picnic preparations for Monday 17th July. The picnic will start at 1:30. There is a limit of four adults per child. We look forward to celebrating with you soon. Thank you for your continued support.

Year One:

In Year 1 this fortnight we have had a wonderful time in Year 2 with Mr Green for transition day. Back in Year 1 we have been getting very excited for our trip to Barry Island! We have written acrostic poems for the new Year 1s telling them all about the brilliant things we get up to, and in maths we have been sorting triangles according to their properties. This week we are creating wanted posters for either the wolf or pig from the story Suddenly! by Colin McNaughton. We have planted some spider plants and are doing a great job of looking after them. Children have taken responsibility for checking if their plant needs water, and we have loved seeing some roots start to grow! Next week we will be joining Reception for Forest School on Friday (14/07/23) for a campfire. Let's hope for a dry couple of days! This means please wear usual school uniform on Monday as instead of Forest School we will be watching the Year 4, 5 and 6 play. As we near the end of the year, please could your children bring in a bag or a box (feel free to decorate an empty cereal box!) to take their work and books home in. Diolch!

Year Two:

In year two we have been redrafting a story that we have planned out; thinking carefully about any spelling corrections, punctuation, grammar and ways to improve sentences. In numeracy we have partitioned numbers to subtract them and taken away using the column method. The pupils used these strategies to solve written problems. Pupils have been enjoying using their French in the outdoor learning café and really impressing me with their grasp of Welsh language sentence patterns. We received a visit from the fire service and learnt how to stay safe during a fire. They stressed the importance of knowing our own addresses so it is really worth checking that your child knows theirs in the event of having to contact the fire service. Our collaboration with year 3 has been going really well and the children can't wait to show you what they have been learning about the regions of France.

Year Three

In Year 3 we have continued working on our creative writing, using lots of different techniques to build imaginative descriptions. In numeracy we have been calculating perimeter of different shapes, and thinking about different methods we can use to do this. We have enjoyed learning French vocabulary to order food and drink in a cafe – I have been so impressed with their language skills! We have been collaborating well with Year 2 to find out about different regions in France, and we're excited to share our work with you next week. The children have also been enjoying our Grub Club sessions, and it is amazing many different skills we have used – following a recipe carefully, communicating with others in the group, adjusting amounts to make the right number of servings, and measuring ingredients accurately. We are in the process of putting together a Trellech cookbook so that your child can recreate our dishes with you at home.

Year 4:

We hope you enjoyed our Express yourself afternoon. We have been so impressed with the children's creations and their own take on the skills of Picasso. Their artwork has created quite an impressive display and certainly brightened up our classroom. We will reluctantly let you have your child's creations at the end of term! Thank you so much for your generous contributions toward Angelman Syndrome. We are looking forward to our trip to Barry Island on Wednesday 12th July. Please ensure your child wears school uniform, has a hat, sun cream on, bring a packed lunch and they can wear sandals. The PTFA have kindly agreed to pay for the bus, which is amazing. So, we thought if the children brought in £3.00 in a labelled envelope on the day, we can get them all an ice cream. In Literacy the children have been retelling the events of a story from a character's perspective. We have spent some time reviewing prior learning and looking at work from previous lessons (emotions graphs, prepositional phrases, similes, speech punctuation), reminding children they can look back at their work for ideas when they are writing. So much fun was had at Forest School when the children created instruments out of natural materials. The last Forest School will be on the last week of school now, as our next scheduled date will be the concert (Tuesday 11th July at 1.30pm). Don't forget their performance on Wednesday 12th at 6.00pm. In Numeracy we have been looking at a written method for short multiplication, e.g multiplying a single digit by either a two or three digit number (4x63 or 5x 127 etc) Ask your child how to set it out correctly and talk you through the steps involved. Thank you for your continued support.

Year Five:

As we head towards the final two weeks in Year 5 we are as busy as ever. Firstly I would like to thank everyone who attended the Express Yourself afternoon, I was very sorry I was unable to attend but I know the children were very proud of the art they produced and really enjoyed teaching the painting techniques too. I was really impressed with their paintings in the style of Monet and how much they had learnt, bendigedig! This week we had our last visit to Forest School for Year 5 were we had the opportunity to get very muddy, something which many of us really enjoyed. We created muddy faces on tree stumps or the tree trunks using mad and other natural materials from around the forest. I was very impressed with some of the art displayed during the afternoon. On Wednesday Year 5 had there taster day in Year 6, something I know they all really enjoyed and were very excited about when they returned to class, they even had the lunch in the courtyard and felt very grown up. We have also enjoyed preparing for our end of year performance of Abi Baba and the Bongo Bandits and have been busy learning the songs ready for the performances next week. We really hope you can join us on either Tuesday 11th July at 1.30pm or Wednesday 12th July at 6pm (children to be in school for 5.30pm please) Please can any remaining costumes be sent in on Monday ready for our dress rehearsal, thank you.

Year 6

The weeks seem to be flying by as we approach the end of term. For year 6 it is a very poignant time, with us reflecting on our years at Trellech, recalling our memories and preparing for the new adventures that await them. Thank you so much for attending our Expressive Yourself afternoon, where you had time to enjoy the wonderful artwork created by your children. Their attention to detail using pointillism has been fantastic and created such an impressive display. Your donations for Angelman Syndrome were very much appreciated. Rehearsals for our show "Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits" are in full swing. We have been focussing on many skills during our rehearsals to enhance our experience of expressive arts. These skills include facial expressions, gestures, pace, tone, body language and diction. These have really helped to enhance our performances and focus our rehearsals. Our expressive arts journey continued this week with a visit from Gwent music, where we were treated to a music masterclass about dynamics, melody and harmony using saxophones, clarinets and flutes. All of our year 6 children have enjoyed two transition days to the comprehensive school, giving them a tiny flavour of the adventures that await them in September. Our final forest school of the year saw us making mud faces, either on trees or tree stumps - the results were amazing!
