Dosbarth Reception

Reception have had a lovely first week back. Miss Light and Miss Ward enjoyed hearing all about the exciting things that the pupils got up to over the half term. As we enter the final weeks of the Autumn Term, we are looking forward to getting started with our Christmas Nativity.

This week the children have continued to work hard in Read Write Inc to learn the new sounds. We are really focussing on our presentation and trying hard to sit all our letters on the line. In Maths, we have started looking at simple addition (o-5) and beginning to build an understanding of how it looks as a sum, with the addition and equals sign. This has provided the children the opportunity to continue to practice their number formation. Miss Light and Miss Ward were so impressed with all the pupils as they really challenged themselves this week.

We have also been learning about the significance of Remembrance Day through class circle time. As a class, we created mini poppy wreaths to decorate our class window as well as used tissue paper to create poppies for the display. We have developed a good understanding as to why it is so important. We also enjoyed another wet forest school with Year 1. The children re-imbedded some previous learning about the importance of friendships and what makes a good friend through creating friendship wands. This will support us further next week for Anti-bullying week. We are also looking forward to participating in Children in Need, so another busy week is ahead.

Miss Light would also like to thank you all for attending parents evening this week. It was so lovely to welcome you back into school. For some it welcomed the return of face-to-face meetings and for others the first experience of a parents evening. Thank you again for all the kind words shared about myself and Miss Ward. We do really appreciate it. Have a lovely weekend!



Dosbarth 1

Croeso i nol, welcome back after a much-needed rest at half term. The weather wasn't great but I hope you were able to enjoy the break.

Before we broke up the school had important visitors and I am really proud to say how well the pupils worked and behaved and this was noticed.

We have continued with story writing using the Clever Writer approach and we have also spent a lot of time on sentence structure, recognising that we really need capitals, full stops and to include a noun and a verb for it to make sense.

In numeracy we have been doubling using money and have classified 2D shapes and listed their properties. The pupils have made predictions about what will happen to eggs when placed in different liquids. This is linked to our work on teeth and how we need to look after them; the eggshell acting as enamel. In Welsh we have been reading a story, learning the related vocabulary and answering questions about the text.

Dosbarth 3

Welcome back – hopefully you all enjoyed a well-deserved week off and are rested and recharged ready for another busy half term! In Literacy before the break, we completed our work based on After the Fall. We explored a character's thoughts and feelings through drama activities, and used our wellbeing work to come up with some advice that we would give to Humpty Dumpty. We worked on developing our writing by using different sentence openers, and uplevelling and improving sentences in different ways, then put our skills into practice to write a retell of the story. Following this the children worked in pairs to create a stopframe animation of part of the story - they needed to make a character, create the backdrop and plan using a storyboard, before taking a series of photographs using careful layering to put together the animation. So many different skills involved, and it was tricky at times, but the children were so supportive of each other and showed great perseverance and resilience. This week, we have been finding out about Remembrance Day. We have researched and made notes on what we read, then put together an information page to share what we have learned in a creative way. We have also explored poetry, learning the features of Haikus then writing our own on the theme of Remembrance. Using different tutorials, we have crested our own poppy art with some really fantastic results. In Maths we have started to use different strategies to multiply numbers, and representing our multiplication in different ways - I have been so impressed with how quickly the children have picked this up. We are really enjoying our samba drumming sessions - we have continued exploring different musical elements, and putting together rhythm patterns to build a piece of music, and are looking forward to sharing this with you.





Dosbarth 4


Every term is just so busy, but we have a feeling that this one is going to be packed with lots of excitement and fun. It won't be long until we start practising for our Carol Concert, creating an enterprise project and designing and making Christmas cards. In Literacy, this week we have been identifying the different jobs that people did during stone age time- hunting, making tools, fire etc. We then compared these jobs to present day jobs and how things have changed. We also created freeze frames to act out the various scenes from Stone Age Boy. The children created poems using personification to celebrate Remembrance Day and we were very proud of their adventurous vocabulary. In Science, after completing an experiment as to how food is absorbed into their bodies, they drew and labelled the digestive system. We are still completing digital Art in the style of Alma Thomas's abstract style which is looking very bright and colourful. Maths has been lots of fun with looking at telling the time on both analogue and digital clocks; as well as reading information from timetables. Keep up the hard work Year 4!

Wow! What a busy fortnight with a half term in between for good measure, the last week of term saw us share our school with some important visitors, and the children were a credit to us all. Sharing their learning, asking and answering questions and showing what super engaged learners we are. We enjoyed a bridge challenge in Forest school, working in small groups to create a natural bridge with a robust success criterion, we enjoyed walking over with Reception and are forming special bonds. We had a great session with our County in the Community football coaches as well as our third swimming lesson where we completed a swim safety test, we are all doing so well with our technique. In literacy we role played, freeze framed and wrote an informal letter, whilst learning more about Floella's journey to England. Did you know between 1948 and 1970 500,000 people left their homes in the West Indies to live in Britain. In maths we worked hard to complete multi-step addition and subtraction word problems. This week we have hit the ground running with our first story of the term in literacy, entering the BBC 500-word competition writing a short story of our choice focusing on character, setting and plot, we are keeping our fingers crossed one of us makes the final... In maths we have moved on to multiplication and division, beginning with multiples and factors. Everyone has worked really hard using resources to support them including one hundred squares. We had our final swimming lesson, a brilliant session with County and the Community and welcomed MonLife leaders on Thursday to support us as Playmakers to support all the children within our school community with activities, games and play during free time. I hope you all had a restful half term, we have an exciting half term ahead with the Y4/5 Christmas Carol Service, Christmas enterprise and all things winter. Dosbarth 6

Year 6 continue to impress me with their creativity, kindness and enthusiasm for learning. Our last week before half term saw us sharing the school with visitors and the whole class showed what a credit they are to the school with the way they spoke and shared their learning so maturely. Our literacy saw us delve deeper into the novel "Wonder", writing a diary entry as if we were August using the skills of show not tell, fronted adverbials and figurative language. The results were amazing with the children using the writers voice so effectively. In maths the children created their own super athlete by testing, timing and ordering the skills of hand/eye coordination, agility, speed, strength and dexterity. We then analysed the food needed to fuel a super athlete and calculated the different foods we could eat for the recommended daily calorie intake. We have also been finding fractions of amounts and simplifying fractions using our knowledge of factors. For science the children continued their learning of the major organs of the body by creating green screen movies, projecting the major organs onto their bodies and describing the functions. We then looked at how we are made up of 46 pairs of chromosomes and made our own reebops (imaginary animals) using a random mix of chromosomes from each parent – the results were fantastic! Year 6 have investigated the advantages and disadvantages of kidney donation, both for the patient and the donor, discussing the issue in an extremely sensitive manner. Forest school saw us making sculptures of ourselves using natural materials and for PE we have begun learning how to control the ball in hockey. Da iawn year 6, keep up the amazing work.
