### Commando Joes

This week, we launched our Commando Joe Missions with the pupils following staff PL at the end of November. Each class completed a mission utilising the equipment to solve a challenge using RESPECT; (Resilience, Excellence, Self-Awareness, Positivity, Excellence, Communication and Teamwork). Each class have had an opportunity to complete a Christmas Mission; some great RESPECT being demonstrated for a first mission. We are very much looking forward to future missions in the New Year.

### Enterprise Projects

As part of our cross curricular learning, each class completed an enterprise project to raise funds to benefit each class. It provides an authentic learning opportunity from costing, design, advertisements, creating products and calculating profit and loss! Each class made some superb festive products and we are very grateful for your support in purchasing products from each class.

In Reception the total profit was **£30** this will be utilised along with the concert raffle money, to develop the Reception Outdoor learning area. In Year One the total profit was **£102** and this will be utilised to further enhance the outdoor provision.

In Year Two the total profit was **£94** this will be used to further enhance the outdoor provision. In Year Three the total profit was **£153** this will be utilised for further resources for enhanced provision. In Year Four the total profit was **£142.07** this will be used to purchase some maths games. In Year Five the Teddy Tombola £109, the enterprise project raised £137 with a total of **£231** minus expenses—Year Five are going to utilise their profit for activities and a treat e.g. hot choc/milkshake on our cultural residential to Cardiff and finally in Year six the total profit was **£213** and this will be used to enhance the courtyard area and towards an end of Year Six celebratory treat!

As you can see your support to such projects is very much appreciated. We would like to express our gratitude to those who helped with donations for the projects; hence keeping the costs down and enabling greater profits to be made! From horse shoes, logs, foliage, baubles to name a few—thank you!

We have had 4 separate incidents involving 5 children who have used a vape and become unwell. At this time the 5 children involved are in the Caerphilly, Newport and Torfaen areas of Gwent. We want all parents and families across Gwent to be aware of this situation and be extra vigilant.

Should any parent be concerned that their child has used a vape containing an illicit drug or toxin, they should call 111 for advice or go to their nearest Emergency Department and report the situation to the police by calling 101.
