Promoting a Nut Free School



Reception have been busy looking at subtraction using tens frames in maths as well as looking at money this week. The children have explored and classified different amounts of money to support their recognition and understanding of 1p,2p,5 and 10p coins. It allowed for an excellent authentic learning opportunity as the children enjoyed engaging in role play based around buying items in a shop for these different prices and working out what they could buy with the coins and what they couldn't. We enjoyed creating our Mother's Day cards using live drawing of daffodils and tulips. All the cards looked fantastic and so much effort went into them by the children to make them perfect and unique for each and every mum. We hope you enjoyed your special day, especially in the lovely sunshine. We have continued to work on our football skills where the children have engaged in scoring a goal and understanding the role of a goalkeeper when trying to save the ball. At forest school, we collaborated with Year 1 to make birds nests in the forest. Now that Spring is well and truly here, we hope our nests will home some of the lovely wildlife there. With the Easter holidays quickly approaching, the children have started to create their Easter cards and will be learning about the story of Easter next week. Dosbarth 1

Prynhawn da, we have had a great fortnight of good weather in Dosbarth Un. The fortnight began with a visit from Gardeners World presenter and award-winning gardener Adam Frost opening our allotments, we also enjoyed planting our seed potatoes with Mrs Cornish on Wednesday, they had been chitting on the windowsill for a while. Did you know that plants require water and light to grow healthy, we have been investigating healthy plants with an investigation into growing healthy cress, as well as learning how to eat healthily and keep ourselves healthy too. In maths we have been estimating and measuring weight with non-standard units and making comparisons. We have also been estimating and measuring capacity. In literacy we have been looking at story settings and described woodlands using the five senses. We also had an assembly as well as discussed, staying safe using the NSPCC video and resources to identify trusted adults that the children can seek if they need support. Dosbarth 2

Prynhawn da, at last we have been treated to some beautiful springtime weather. The pupils have really enjoyed a forest school walk. Please see X formally Twitter for photographs that I have posted. The school had a visit from Adam Frost and had a tour of the outside area taking in all the wonderful gardening the children have been a part of. We have enjoyed hockey sessions and county in the community outside. They have been using construction materials, weighing, creating models with junk materials and playing shop outside, making the most of the weather. A shame I have missed the start of some new areas in our lessons but so far: In literacy we have watched the 'True story of the 3 little pigs' by Jon Szeiscka. We have planned a story using the beginning, middle and ending format and have started to rewrite it in our own words in paragraphs. We will be creating our own alternative fairy tale later in the year. In numeracy we have looked at the time, and we have been revising money; carrying out coin recognition, making amounts and converting between pounds and pence. In science we have observed an experiment on colour absorption and recorded our observations. In Welsh we have begun to read a Welsh text and we are preparing to answer questions based upon it. The children thoroughly enjoyed their expressive arts time creating Mother's Day cards.



Dosbarth 3

Prynhawn da, we have had a very busy fortnight in Year 3, especially practising for our Easter Assembly. The children have worked so hard to learn their lines and throughout the week have developed amazing confidence when performing in front of others. We are looking forward to sharing the final performance with everyone next week. In Literacy the children have investigated adverbial phrases within their writing for our class text the Welsh myth, Branwen. They have written their own descriptive setting in Star write, edited their ideas and then used a success criteria to find evidence of the key features included. This is a tricky skill and the children all completed it wonderfully. In Numeracy the children have been using their estimation skills to round up and down to complete addition and subtraction problems. Within our authentic learning tasks, the children used their estimation skills to plan for an Easter picnic. As part of developing Welsh phrases in the class, the children used amazing DCF skills to create animations. Here, the characters use the phrases in both J2E and Scratch Jr. The collaboration within the groups to create the animations and debugging of instructions has been amazing. Have a lovely weekend all.



Dosbarth 4

We can't quite believe this term is coming to an end and we will soon be in our final term. We hope you were spoilt on Mother's Day and managed to enjoy the sunshine. The children worked in stages to create "Our Blossom Time" in the style of Therese James. I am sure you will find somewhere nice to hang the painting. The cards were in the style of Georgia O' Keeffe and we used a mixture of oil pastels and paint. During Health and Wellbeing sessions, we have been discussing signs of a healthy and an unhealthy relationship and what these may look like. The children have been very mature in their discussions and activities. We have also been using some resources from the NSPCC and their theme 'Stay safe- speak out.' Our literacy lessons have been based around the enchanting, Poetry Book- Lost Words. We spent time looking at the beautiful illustrations, together with finding definitions of words we were unsure of. (There were lots). We explained to the children that these words are disappearing from our language, and we need to create a spell to bring them back into our language. The children crafted acrostic poems, weaving words like ember, tinder pyre, etc. We created similes, metaphors and alliteration to write an Acrostic poem that began to dance off the page. Poetry requires abstract thinking and can sometimes feel intimidating. But Lost Words has encouraged creativity and emotional expression, allowing the children to articulate their feelings. This book has certainly fostered a deeper understanding of language and creativity. I am sure the children have told you about April Fool's Day! So much fun. I put 32nd of March on the board and most (not all), copied it down. We watched a video about penguins flying and basking in the Amazon, made them some brown e's, got them to plant some donut seeds. Lots of them wanted to take the spare one's home to plant! Then we had a nonsense spelling test and I got them to go outside on the yard as google maps were updating their images of the school grounds. Musically, we have been listening to Gustav Holst's Mars, which paints various images which are unique to us as individuals; together with dynamic colours and shapes. The children were then encouraged to draw images whilst listening to this powerful piece of music- which was very interesting. The instruments resound with purpose, and together we are discovering terms like crescendo, decrescendo, ostinato, and pulse. In small groups, the children were encouraged to experiment and express themselves through sound; composing their own melodies with a variety of instruments, unleashing their inner composers! We look forward to seeing you next Friday 11th April at 10.30am for a short showcase of their African drumming sessions. Thank you for your continued support.













Dosbarth 5

It has been lovely to be making the most of the warmer weather with some outdoor learning activities. The children have been relishing the opportunity to explore their surroundings while we immerse ourselves in our current topics. In literacy, I'm excited to share that we have completed our dragon reports. The children have done a fantastic job describing everything from the dragons' habitats and appearances to their diets. These reports will come together to form a fabulous class book titled "Dragonology," which we can't wait to share with you! We've also been diving into our "Grow a Pound" entrepreneur theme, where the children are busy creating their own businesses. They've been crafting business plans and identifying their target customer base. Keep your eyes peeled for the adverts they'll be creating soon—it's all very thrilling! In maths, we've been focusing on spotting number and pattern relationships and rules, before moving on to multiplying using the grid method. It was wonderful to witness so much perseverance from everyone in the class, and I'm proud of their progress. In PE, our hockey skills are continuously progressing, with lots of impressive techniques on show as we compete against each other in houses. The children's enthusiasm and sportsmanship were commendable! Last week, we teamed up with Year 6 for some exciting forest school activities. The children enjoyed creating dens with set criteria, and it was heartening to see such exemplary teamwork on display. Some of the dens were simply amazing! In health and well-being, we've been delving into financial literacy, learning how to track our income and expenditure. We also took the time to discuss safety, using the NSPCC video to identify trusted adults that the children can turn to if ever in need of support. Finally, our drumming sessions with Upbeat have been fabulous! The children have just completed their last practice ahead of our performance next Friday. We can't wait to welcome you to showcase the art of Taiko drumming!

Prynhawn da, we have had a lovely two weeks in Dosbarth 6! The students have shown great enthusiasm and engagement in our recent activities. In literacy, we started developing our adverts, allowing the children to tap into their creativity and apply persuasive language techniques. They have been brainstorming innovative ideas and collaborating with peers to create compelling advertisements, which has sparked lively discussions and imaginative thinking. In science and technology, we've continued our in-depth exploration of the human skeleton. The students have been fascinated by learning the different bones, their functions, and how they contribute to our overall health. As we transition into writing a non-chronological report to present our findings, they are excited to organise their research and share what they've learned in a structured format. The project encourages them to think critically about how to communicate information effectively. Additionally, we've investigated the importance of sleep and how it can significantly impact our mental health and well-being. Through discussions and activities, the children have been learning about healthy sleep habits and the benefits of rest, which is essential for both their academic performance and personal growth. In physical education, we've continued to develop our skills in football and netball in preparation for the upcoming Raglan cluster event.
